

# PFAFF

## Elegant Wrap Created especially for Pfaff



The perfect accessory for a cool summer evening, this heirloom-style wrap will dress up any outfit.

**SUPPLIES YOU'LL NEED:**

2 yards of sheer fabric  
1 1/4 yards each of two 1 1/2"-wide decorative ribbons  
Air- or water-soluble marking pen  
1 1/4 yards of beaded trim  
1 1/4 yards of decorative trim  
Narrow Edge Foot

**FABRIC CUTTING DIRECTIONS:**

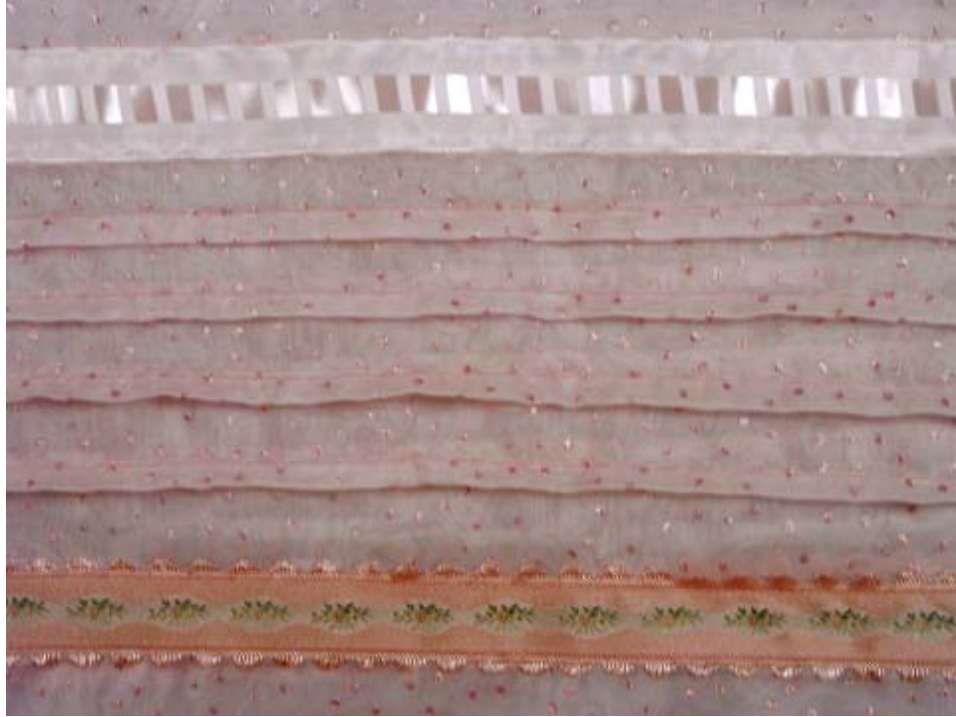
Cut a piece of fabric, the length of the fabric by 22"-wide.  
Cut the two ribbons, the beaded trim and the decorative trim in half.

**LET'S GET STARTED:**

1. Measure and mark from each end the placement lines for the tucks and ribbon trims following the drawing shown here.
- <ILLO: ES1>
2. Pin the first strip of ribbon 8" from the bottom edges at the marks. Stitch in place along each edge with your Narrow Edge Foot.
  3. From the edge of the ribbon, measure 1" to the next mark. Fold the fabric making a tuck. Stitch 3/8" from the edge to hold. Press the tuck down along the seamline. Repeat making four tucks on each end of the shawl.

<ILLO: ES2>

4. Measure 1" from the last tuck and pin the remaining ribbon to the shawl. Stitch using your Narrow Edge Foot.



5. Fold up a 1/2" hem toward the right side at each end of the shawl and pin.

6. Pin the beaded trim to the right side of the shawl over the raw edge of the hem. Baste in place using the longest stitch length on your machine through the hem and header on the beaded trim.

<ILLO: ES3>

7. Pin the decorative trim over the header and stitch through all the layers to hold. This is a perfect place to use plain ribbon and one of your great 9mm decorative stitches.

8. Turn in 1/2" twice along both edges of the shawl. Pin.

9. Select a hemstitch on your machine (stitch #139 on the Pfaff *creative* 2140).  
Stitch to hold the side hems in place.
