

Pot Grabber Mit

Designed and created especially for Pfaff

This simple pot grabber mit protects your hands all around allowing you to pick up even the hottest pots & pans.



Supplies You'll Need:

- Pfaff creative Embroidery Machine
- Pfaff creative Card/CD 328 Autumn, design 15
- Rayon embroidery thread
- 2 – 7" x 9", 1 – 7" x 7" & 1 – 8" x 8" terrycloth
- 1 – 7" x 7" & 1 – 7" x 9" lightweight cotton batting
- 1 – 7" x 7" & 1 – 7" x 9" InsulBright® (heat-resistant layer - available at your Pfaff Dealer)
- Medium to Heavy-weight Water-soluble stabilizer for backing and lightweight water-soluble as a top layer (to keep threads from burying into the terrycloth fabric)
- Temporary adhesive spray
- 1 1/4 yard – 2 1/4" wide bias for binding



Let's Get Started:

1. Hoop a layer of the medium to heavyweight water-soluble stabilizer and lightly spray with temporary adhesive.
2. Center the 8" x 8" fabric in the embroidery field. Place a layer of the lightweight water-soluble on top of the terrycloth to help keep the threads from burying in the loops.
3. Embroider your selected motif in the center.
4. Remove from hoop and rinse away all excess stabilizer. Allow to dry. Trim to 7" x 7".
5. Sandwich the 7" x 7" batting and InsulBright layers between the 7" x 7" layers of

terrycloth. Zigzag around all four sides close to the edge of the fabric. Repeat for the larger pieces.

6. Position the smaller padded piece on the larger and baste in place.
7. Bind all four edges, mitering at the corners.
