



Trick or Treat Jacket by Margaret Moorehead

This Boo-tiful jacket is chock full of sewing tricks - decorative stitches, metallic threads, appliques and fabric weaving all join together to create a jacket that will be a treat to wear.

SUPPLIES YOU'LL NEED:

- Jacket pattern of choice
- Halloween applique motifs (based on PATCHWORK PUMPKINS AND GINGERBREAD BOYS)
- Fusible web
- Halloween inspired fabrics
- Lining
- Fusible batting
- Pattern tracing material
- Rayon and metallic threads
- Free-motion quilt foot

FABRIC CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Cut lining according to pattern. Cut jacket back and one sleeve according to pattern.
2. For jacket front, trace two jacket fronts onto pattern tracing material. Draw horizontal cutting lines on traced pieces for different fabric sections. Cut along lines. Cut each of these sections from a different Halloween fabric, adding seams allowances along curved edges.
3. Cut fabric into 1" x 28" strips, about 6 strips of each fabric.

EMBROIDERY:

1. Weave 1" strips together to create a surface large enough for one sleeve. Fuse to batting and cut out remaining sleeve. Embellish with decorative stitches.
2. Fuse batting to other sleeve and embellish all over with free-motion quilting in metallic thread. Couch threads if desired.

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3. Fuse jacket front and back pieces to batting and free-motion quilt. Fuse Halloween motifs to jacket front and back and applique using a satin stitch.
4. Complete jacket according to pattern directions.
